RE: SUNUNU UP 1-POINT IN TIGHT NH SENATE RACE

DATE: SEPTEMBER 1, 2026

In a survey of likely New Hampshire voters conducted by Fabrizio, Lee & Associates (see methodology on the following page), Republican John Sununu holds a narrow 1-point lead over Democrat Chris Pappas in the race for U.S. Senate. Independent candidates each receive 1% support or less, while 23% of voters remain undecided. While the race is statistically tied and well within the survey's margin of error, these results clearly challenge the prevailing media narrative that Democrats have a lock on New Hampshire. Instead, the findings show a highly competitive contest with a large pool of persuadable voters still in play. Granite Staters are taking a fresh look at John Sununu because they remember his record of leadership and effective representation. As voters focus on the issues that matter most to their families and communities, they are increasingly open to sending Sununu back to the U.S. Senate to fight for New Hampshire's interests.

METHODOLOGY STATEMENT: Fabrizio, Lee & Associates conducted a survey of 600 likely voters in New Hampshire between August 27-30, 2026. The interviews were split 40% live-operator cell phone/15% live-operator landline/45% SMS to web. Gender, age, race/ethnicity, party, education, and geography were matched to demographic profiles of likely voters based on exit polls and the voter file. Respondents were randomly selected from the voter file. The margin of sampling error at the 95% confidence interval is $\pm 4.0\%$.
